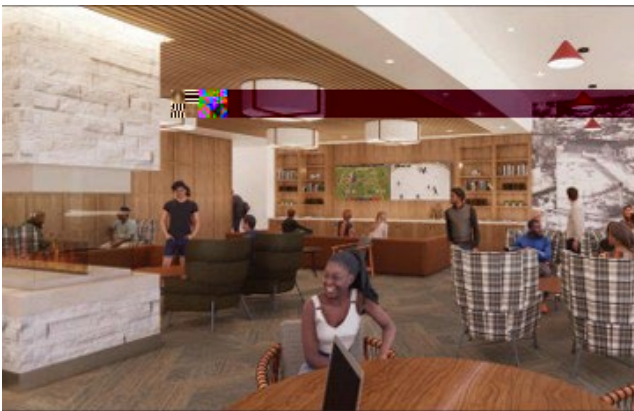

## Wabash News

- On May 11, 2024, one hundred eighty-four men of the Class of 2024 received their diplomas from President Scott Feller. A photo album of the commencement can be found here: [2024 Commencement Album](#).
- For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, Wabash exceeded its fundraising goals for the 2023-24 fiscal year. Here are some highlights:
  - Annual Fund Dollars Raised: \$3,808,088 (exceeding our \$3.7 million goal)
  - Alumni Donors: 4,909
  - Alumni Participation: 40.25%, the 11th consecutive year at 40% or higher
- In July, the Fiske Guide to Colleges named Wabash College one of the best and most interesting colleges and universities in the U.S., Canada, Great Britain, and Ireland. The guide highlighted Wabash's academic environment, campus traditions, the gorgeous Arboretum, and athletic successes, among others. **Favorite Wabash Class or Professor:** “Prof. Mikek. Just an incredibly kind man, someone who I believe has every student’s true interest in his heart.”



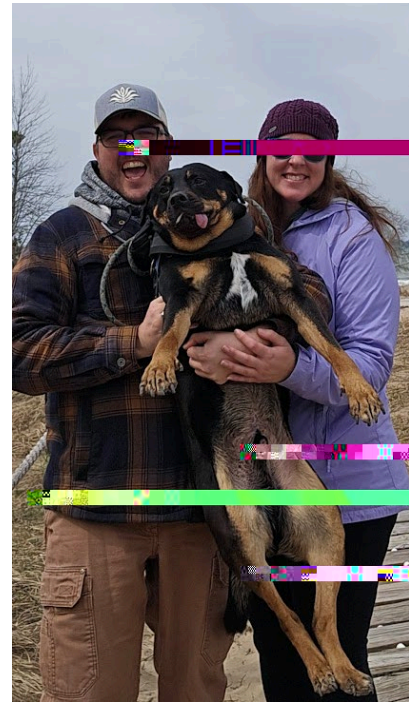
## Torm Hustvet
